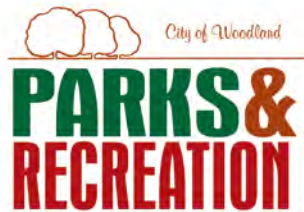

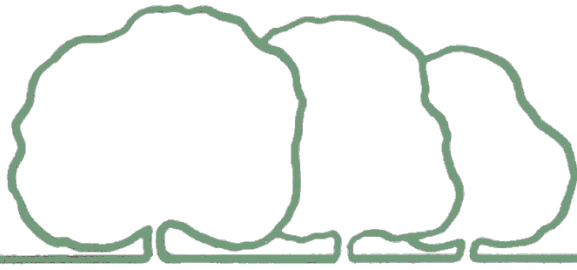

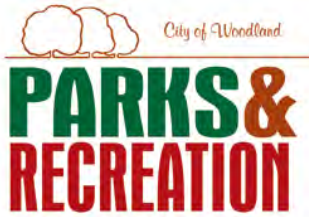

Items to note

- **Lunch Time Activities**

Our efforts to help boost numbers in the Chit Chat Café on the slower day, we have used Intern, Danielle Craig to help engage the seniors. She has gotten creative in running various trivia and Bingo games, and she is currently working on a recognition game. She puts a lot of effort into having the seniors connect and engage, other than just sitting and eating. ENP has helped with gathering small little prizes to be given to winners. Also during lunch AllWest comes once a month to show videos of upcoming destinations and a senior volunteer shows slide shows of his travels throughout the world. With all the activities, there are about 10 days in which there is more activity/presentation during lunch for the lunch crowd to listen (or not) to.

- **AllWest Travel program**

May's trips for AllWest went to Fairfield, Yosemite, and to the Winchester Mystery House. The program takes a bit of time and effort, but so far it runs smoothly. Seniors are enjoying having an opportunity for day trips. We received our \$450 commission check for the Yosemite and Healdsburg. Upcoming for July and August, we have All West trips going to the Gilroy Garlic Festival, Eureka, and the Feather River casino.

- **June Movie, The King's Speech**

A surprise to all, forty people came to watch The King's Speech on June 16. Staff wasn't quite prepared to have so many for the movie, but it worked out. A suggestion of we anticipate more than 15 for the movie is to move to the Youth Center with the large screen and movie-type chairs. It may be a lot of work, but we feel it would be a positive move, and then they also wouldn't be so crowded.
