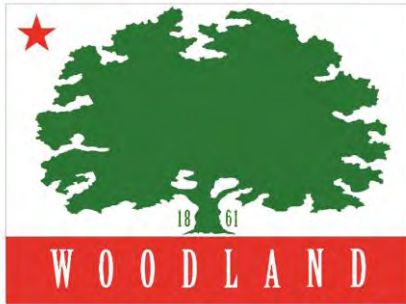

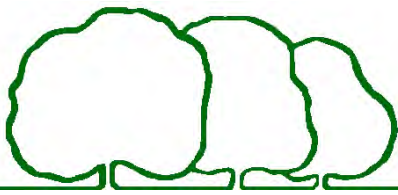

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The following provides highlights of the Senior Center since the last report.

Program Report

Welcome Desk Meeting: The Senior Center Welcome Desk is operated by 20+ volunteers who help answer phones, register people for programs, and guide people to their locations. In April staff conducted the annual Welcome Desk meeting where all volunteers came to discuss issues and procedures they encounter while working. This helps to maintain consistent customer service to all Senior Center users.

“Being Mortal” Screening: The Woodland Senior Center is partnering with Yolo Hospice to bring a screening of PBS Frontline’s “Being Mortal” to local citizens on Friday June 10. This film explores the hopes of patients and families facing terminal illness and their relationships with the physicians who treat them. Also partnering with Yolo Hospice are St. John’s Village and Dignity Healthcare.

Teens Helping Seniors: The Teens Helping Seniors program utilizes teen volunteers during their summer break to assist older adults in Woodland with yardwork or housework. Work request forms can be picked up at the Woodland Senior Center. The volunteers are rewarded with a trip to the Santa Cruz Beach Boardwalk at the end of summer. THS is offering a spaghetti feed fundraiser on Wednesday June 22.
